56th FW changes its mission

Luke Air Force Base's 56th Fighter Wing conducted a Change of Mission ceremony May 21, formally including the F-35 Lightning II as part of the wing's new mission statement.

The ceremony included the military tradition of unveiling 56th FW commander, Brig. Gen. Scott Pleus' name on the flagship F-35, signifying the mission change.

Thereafter, Pleus began his remarks to the hangarful of Airmen and community leaders by looking back at Luke's history.

"If you go back to Feb-

ruary of 1941, the City of Phoenix authorized the War Department, as it was called back then, the ability to build a training base out in the west side of Phoenix," Pleus said. "The state of Arizona saw the ability to bring the military into the Arizona community, just like they do today. Their unbelievably generous opportunity resulted in leasing this land to the United States Air Force for one dollar a year and that still holds true today."

Luke AFB currently has 23 F-35s and by 2024, Luke is scheduled to have six fighter squadrons and 144 F-35s. In the next few years, 10 other countries are planning to conduct F-35 training at Luke, including Norway, Italy, Turkey,

Netherlands, Denmark, Canada, Israel, Japan and South Korea. Australia has already arrived and is flying with the 61st Fighter Squadron.

"Today we take another step forward for the U.S. Air Force and our partner nations by formally updating our mission statement. Beginning today the mission of Luke Air Force Base is simple - train the world's greatest F-35 and F-16 fighter pilots."

Pleus then welcomed Lorraine Martin, Executive Vice President and General Manager of the F-35 Lightning II program with Lockheed Martin, to the stage.

Over the next few months, Fighter Country Foundation will be finalizing our FAAR committee and "enlisting our force" to start a




Luke will always be upgrading and building new facilities that are "mission critical" and are directly linked to the success of "train-

F-35 pilot training starts in Luke classroom

May 4 marked another historic day at Luke Air Force Base when the first pilot training class began for the F-35 Lightning II joint strike fighter. Two F-16 Fighting Falcon instructor pilots and two A-10 Warthog instructor pilots applied and were selected for the first student F-35 training class at Luke.

"Luke's Academic Training Center focuses on the academic and simulator training and the 61st Fighter Squadron will train on the flying piece," said Lt. Col. Matt Hayden, 56th Training Squadron director of operations. "It's a build-up approach training where we start with academics, move to hands-on training with the simulators and finally to the aircraft. The F-35 is built in a way to introduce students to the basic overall aircraft handling of its systems and what makes up the F-35."

The students learn various systems throughout the aircraft and how they work together hydraulics, electrical, the engine and flight controls are systems every pilot must understand

prior to taking flight.

"Initially the training will be focused on understanding the airplane: how to take off, land, fly formation, and how to interact with all the sensors on the aircraft," Hayden said. "As the training progresses we look at a tactical approach as far as how to employ the airplane - air-to-air, air-to-ground, what the capabilities and limitations of the aircraft are and how to communicate."

There are many resources instructors use to teach students.

"The tools in the ATC are set

up to help immerse the students in the aircraft environment in an academic way," Hayden said. "The student stations in each of the classrooms have large monitors and a stick and throttle. In addition to that, the instructor at the front of the classroom has a couple of projectors which enable him to bring up a console or any of the students' consoles to talk about what the student sees on the displays."

The displays are a panoramic touch screen and can be customized to every scenario.

"The displays can also be manipulated using the stick and throttle which gives students a way to familiarize themselves with the glass display and build comfort with the 'switch-ology' of the aircraft," Hayden said. "We want to get the students familiarized with all of these things long before they get into the aircraft or even the simulator. It helps them understand how that interface works between the pilot and the airplane."

The training in total from academics to simulators to flightline takes approximately three months. This first class is training to become flight ready with the F-35 but to also become instructors upon completion of the course.

"The pilots going through the training right now are going to be staying here at Luke to be instructors," Hayden said. "When they graduate they may very well turn around in a matter of days to instructing students in what they just learned, which is why we chose previous fighter pilot instructors to be in the first class to have that tactical experience."

The students have many challenges ahead of them to become F-35 pilots as well as knowledgeable enough to lead and instruct future classes.

"It's exciting to be the first class at Luke," said Maj. Eric Puels, 944th Operations Group Detachment 2 student. "A couple of us have been part of this program since 2008, and we're looking forward to hitting the ground running. It was extremely competitive to apply to become an F-35 pilot let alone to be accepted. My father was a fighter pilot, he flew F-4 Phantoms, so I always wanted to fly the best fighters and the F-35 is the best."







years from your lives, which were given so selflessly, so that others might live in a land where tyranny doesn't control, but in a land of the free and the home of the brave," said Lunde.

"We, at Freedom Plaza, share our heartfelt gratitude for every sacrifice you have made to allow so many to feel the peace and safety of living in a free United States of America. By dedicating this Hall of Honor to you, our veterans, we thank you for your service," said Lunde in her opening remarks prior to conducting the ribbon-cutting ceremony.

The Maricopa County Sheriff's Office Honor Guard presented the colors and saluted the resident veterans as they entered the Hall of Honor.

Many of the veterans came decked in military uniforms, medals and dog tags, and were proud to point out their photos as residents viewed the Hall of Honor portrait gallery.

"I retired May 1, 1965, and luckily still fit in this 50-year-old uniform," said Ret. Lt. Col. U.S. Air Force, Donald Sellon. "I'm pictured in 1943, within a month or two of joining the Army Air Corps. During pilot training the instructor talked through a funnel into the headset, there was no talking back."

"I've had the privilege of having close and wonderful interfaces with highranking members of the fighter pilot community because I was assigned to

a fighter squadron as an Honorary Commander. However, it's every bit as much the maintainers, the medical staff, security, life support, ordinance, range control, officers, airmen, etc., who make the mission successful. They embody common values and the willingness to sacrifice everything. It's an ongoing honor to have access to these men, women and their families and to know those who serve at the 'Tip of the Spear."

The Blue Blazer Squadron (BBS) is an Alumni Association of the Honorary Commanders Committee of Fighter Country Partnership (FCP), that provides support for the men and women of Luke Air Force Base through FCP, and is a prominent volunteer force representing FCP in the community. When asked about his most memorable time as an Honorary Commander, Darrell said he had trouble citing just one.

"One of the most moving and unforgettable ex-

periences of my life was the memorial for Major Troy Gilbert on Dec. 6, 2006."

Background: Major Troy Gilbert, 34, was assigned to the 309th Fighter Squadron at Luke and died November 27, 2006 when his F-16C fighter crashed 20 miles northwest of Baghdad while deployed to the 332nd Expeditionary Wing, Balad Air Force Base, Iraq serving during Operation Iraqi Freedom. Major Gilbert was killed in action while on a mission protecting others. He was posthumously awarded the Distinguished Flying Cross with Valor.

Wilson also remembers having a casual lunch conversation with one of his squadron commanders, as he described why he served.


"My commander shared his deep feelings about what it means to be a fighter pilot and the misperceptions that some people have. It wasn't about him. It was about serving his country and serving it well. I learned then that these are different and very special people and what service really means. I want to give special thanks to all my Squadron Commanders: Skip, Buster, Batman, Pablo, Hack,


Vandal, Shady and Jeb. I love these guys and their families. Presently, my time with Jeb and the 61st Fighter Squadron has been sort of like a foster home. It's awesome!"

The purpose of the NSF is to expose influential citizens to senior U.S. and international officers and civilian equivalents in order to engage each other's ideas and perspectives on Air Force, national and international security



Veteran with cancer receives family vacation from American Legion

When Humphrey Bogart and Ingrid Bergman's love story in "Casablanca" was released in early 1943, Galen Christianson was 17 years old. He perhaps did not so much see the romance between Rick and Ilsa, but instead saw the menace of the German army as it marched into France. Instead, he felt the patriotism of the French as they tried to out-sing the German's National Anthem.

Watching the film, one can envision the reasons he used when he begged his mother to let him sign on to service early. That was the kind of man he was. She would not, however, give permission to her under-aged son. But Galen Christianson turned 18 that April and by June he was in Abilene, Texas going through basic training. Nothing, however, could prepare him for

what he would face over fellow soldiers get mowed the next two years.

Private Christianson was among the first wave of infantry to land 71 years ago at Omaha Beach June 6, 1944. Trained as a medic, he was armed only with medical supplies and plasma. Lying in the water 100 yards away from a German machine gun nest, he watched his

down. Some reports say that one in three men from the 116th regiment of the 29th Division was killed that day. His supplies were exhausted well before the injuries were.

Galen Christianson is an American hero. He went on to fight his way through France and into Germany. Just as the Ger-



mans had when invading Paris, he marched - in Allied victory - through the arch de' triomphe. He went on to live a long life. Originally from Minnesota, he spent 30 years in Sun City. He had many thank him for his service. He told his stories to his children and their children.

But what of those that did not? And what of those that will not?

Today, 47-year-old Specialist Steven Aberle, exposed to radiation while serving in Iraq, is battling stage-four cancer. He will leave behind his two children and wife. Despite the war tragedy

his family now faces, his son, Alex, plans to enlist in the Army Rangers. This is just one example of today's American heroes. These are the men and women who continue to face our nation's enemies with bravery and commitment. These are the families who face the loss

of their loved ones not just during their service, but after their service as well. They suffer without fanfare and in quiet agony.

Dwight Eisenhower called D-Day "a great and noble undertaking" and it

'Swiss Army Knife of the Air' tours at Mesa CAF Museum

A World War II aircraft thought to have the most extensive combat history in the 160-plus warbird fleet of the Commemorative Air Force (CAF) is ready to tell her story after 70 years of silence.

Old Number 30, a humble C-47 Skytrain flown by the 60th Troop Carrier Group in Northern Africa, Sicily and Yugoslavia from 1943 to 1945, is the latest acquisition of the Arizona unit of the CAF located in Mesa.

Swiss Army Knife of the Air

General Dwight D. Eisenhower called the C-47 one of the "most important tools" used by the Allies to win WWII—the largest and most destructive war of all time.

Eisenhower's "tool" literally was the Swiss Army Knife of the Air, dropping paratroopers, spies, ammunition and weapons, towing gliders stuffed with infantry and artillery; making short field takeoffs from grass strips of 1,500 feet, according to one account

A World War II aircraft ought to have the most tensive combat history describing a planeload of refugees scooped up to escape attacking Nazis.

In the seven decades it took for the stories about these often secret and always dangerous missions to surface, Old Number 30 was like many C-47s after the war that were sold as surplus and used by airlines and oil companies or as executive transportation.

The combat service of this specific aircraft was only just discovered during the past year.

Among the documents detailing its lengthy combat record, a copy of General Order Number 233 dated Nov. 12, 1944 was found, awarding the Distinguished Unit Badge, now known as the Presidential Unit Citation, to the 60th Troop Carrier Group for "...displaying unfailing courage and superior flying ability, group pilots skillfully landed on and took off in hours of darkness, often by instruments, from small hastilyimprovised landing strips hidden in deep valleys and under constant threat of

enemy ground action.

Making more than 600 such hazardous landings, planes of the 60th Troop Carrier Group unloaded quantities of critically needed supplies too bulky for parachuting, including jeeps and mules, evacuating on the return trip many Allied airmen, wounded partisans and civilian refugees.

From March 28 to Sept. 15, 1944, this group, flying more than 15,000 hours and completing nearly 3,000 missions, delivered

more than 7,000 tons of weapons, ammunition, clothing, food and medicine, dropped millions of news and propaganda leaflets, and evacuated thousands of military and civilian personnel..."

This aircraft is one of seven warbirds flown at CAF Airbase Arizona's Mesa facility providing living history experiences in the air for the purpose of educating the public and honoring the service of U.S. and Allied veterans.

A CAF volunteer crew guides visitors through a flight briefing and the flight itself to tell her heroic story. A \$250 per person fee is required to offset operation and maintenance of the vintage

aircraft.

The briefing and flight take about one hour. Reservations for flights should be made in advance via e-mail to rides@azcaf. org, or by calling 602-448-2350.

A minimum of six passengers are needed to schedule a flight. The CAF Ride Coordinator will make every effort to combine individuals and smaller groups to make a flight.

The C-47 built by Douglas Aircraft in 1943 that became Old Number 30 was acquired by the Commemorative Air Force in Arizona in 2014. She was in nearly continuous operation after WWII with multiple private and corporate owners, including that of the Hoover Corporation. Hoover installed the historic executive interior found in the aircraft today.

CAF Arizona members volunteer thousands of hours to operate and maintain Old Number 30 for the benefit of the public. You, too, can board this trip back in time with Old Number 30 at the CAF Airbase Arizona & Museum, 2017 N. Greenfield Road, Mesa, AZ 85215, www.azcaf.org.



Battle of Midway Remembrance Day held in Arizona; heroes honored posthumously

A proclamation was issued by the Office of the Governor, designating June 5, 2015 as "Battle of Midway Remembrance Day" in Arizona. The declaration recognizes the significance of the World War II battle in the Pacific as a turning point in the historic conflict with Japan and identifies the contributions made by Arizonans to the successful outcome of one of the most crucial naval battles of the war.

In particular, the gallantry of Navy Ensign John C. Butler, Jr., of Liberty (Buckeye), Ariz. is acknowledged. Butler, a dive bomber pilot assigned to Bombing Squadron 3 aboard the U.S.S. Yorktown, was killed in action while attacking the Japanese fleet on the afternoon

of June 4, 1942.

He was posthumously awarded the Navy Cross, the Navy's highest honor. In addition, the Navy subsequently commissioned a destroyer escort bearing his name as a tribute to his accomplishments.

The Battle of Midway has been designated by the Chief of Naval Operations as one of the two most important dates in the history of the United States Navy, the other being the establishment of the Navy Oct. 13, 1775. June 4, 1942, barely six months following the crippling surprise attack on the U.S. Pacific Fleet at Pearl Harbor, Hawaii, a supposedly superior force of Japanese naval units attacked the U.S. naval base at Midway Atoll, 1,300 miles northwest of

Hawaii.

The attack was a bid to capture the base and annihilate the remaining American naval units in the Pacific, thus paving the way for an invasion of the Hawaiian Islands.

American forces ambushed the Japanese fleet June 4, resulting in the sinking of four of Japan's front-line aircraft carriers, which played a major role in Japan's success thus far in Pacific expansion -- including the Pearl Harbor attack.

The Battle of Midway is considered by historians to be the turning point in the Pacific War with Japan, signaling the end to Japanese expansion and the beginning of a relentless drive to defeat the Japanese, which concluded with the unconditional surrender of Japan's forces in Tokyo Bay Sept. 2, 1945.

A special two-hour ceremony to commemorate the battle was held on the third floor of the State Capitol Museum, at 1700 W. Washington St. in Phoenix. Attendees heard presentations about the events

leading up to and occurring during and after the historic naval engagement.


Making special appearances were Jack Holder (93), a Pearl Harbor survivor and participant in the Midway battle; and retired Navy Rear Admiral Hugh Dennis Wisely, decorated Naval Aviator, former member of the Navy's Blue Angels aerial acrobatics team and Captain of the aircraft carrier, U.S.S. John F. Kennedy, who spoke to the importance of naval aviation and its future as a necessary ingredient in the nation's defense. The commemoration also honored the memory of Ensign Butler.


Events such as these continue to educate the public about the significance of World War II and

Arizona's role in bringing the conflict to a successful end, 70 years ago. In 2013, the state unveiled Arizona's World War II Memorial, at Wesley Bolin Memorial Plaza, which includes one 14-inch gun from the U.S.S. Arizona (sunk at Pearl Harbor on December 7, 1941) and one 16-inch gun from the U.S.S. Missouri (upon whose decks the Japanese signed the instrument of surrender in September 1945, bringing World War II to a close).

Because 2015 marks the 70th anniversary of the end of World War II, this year's annual commemoration of the turning point in the Pacific War offered significant overtones at a time of national observance.

that Lockheed Martin and our entire team are proud to stand beside you in every step of your journey," Martin said. "We have every expectation that Team Luke will set the standard for F-35 training, as you have done with the F-16, the most successful fourthgeneration pilots the world has ever known."

Martin closed by thanking the surrounding community, Air Force partners and allies, and thanked them for their service.

The change in the mission statement is historical for Luke because the base has been an F-16 Fighting Falcon-only installation for 19 years. The 56th FW last changed its mission 25 years ago.

The 56th Fighter Wing is one of the most highly decorated aviation units in history and has a legacy tracing back to 1941. Since

then, the 56th has moved a number of times and has undergone a few name changes before arriving at Luke Air Force Base April 1, 1994, flying F-16s and F-15E Strike Eagles. A year later, the F-15E training mission moved to Seymour Johnson Air Force Base, North Carolina. Since then, the wing's core mission has been to train the world's greatest F-16 pilots. It wasn't until

March 10, 2014 when the wing received its first F-35A aircraft that changes began to appear.

Some of the recent changes include the opening of the F-35 Academic Training Center Oct. 9, 2014. Jan. 23, Pleus flew his last sortie in an F-16, representing a step toward the future for Airmen at Luke. Additionally, the wing successfully com-

pleted a first-ever, largescale training deployment of 10 F-35s to Nellis Air Force Base, Nevada, showcasing the aircraft's abilities. Recently, a Royal Australian Air Force pilot flew the base's first partner F-35 sortie May 14 at Luke.

Pleus wrapped up his comments by talking about the relationship between the base and the local community.

"The state of Arizona, and particularly the West Valley, has always welcomed us with open arms and we deeply appreciate all the efforts you had to bring the F-35 to Luke," Pleus said. "We would not be where we are today if we didn't have the support of some great people that have put us to where we are."
