AF COOL program accepts tuition assistance for industry recognized credentials

Rio Salado College Offers COOL Testing Services and Credit for Prior Learning Opportunities

The U.S. Air Force Credentialing Opportunities On-Line (AF COOL) program, which is a part of the Air Force Virtual Education Center, is now accepting tuition assistance dollars to help airmen secure industry recognized credentials.

Industry-recognized credentials are a great way for airmen to bolster their Air Force careers and prepare for a transition to civilian employment as they retire or separate from the Air Force.

There are many industries such as information technology, healthcare, and financial services that require credentials or are

preferred by employers. It is not uncommon for these industries to require certifications, regardless of an applicant's post-secondary education level.

Airmen are limited to pursuing credentials that are approved for their Air Force Specialty Codes (AFSCs), when they are using Air Force tuition assistance dollars to pay for their credentials. Airmen are also limited to one credential at a cost of up to \$4,500. The Air Force will pay for recertification for the same credential until the \$4,500 stipend is exhausted.

The cost for credentials varies greatly and Airmen may find that using Air Force COOL funds for the most expensive certification guarantees that they are maximizing their use of this valuable benefit.

Many of the certification exams, which are administered by Pearson VUE, are available through Rio Salado College's Valley-wide testing centers, including Rio Salado's National Testing Center at Luke AFB, in building 1150 (The Block House). Visit www.riosalado.edu/testing/Pages/af-cool.aspx for a complete listing of the certification exams.

Rio Salado College recognizes many credentials as credit for prior learning, which can be applied toward a certificate or degree.

"Credit for prior learning is credit for college level knowledge obtained through certifications, non-traditional schooling and other experience," said Rio Salado Director of Academic Advisement



Lightning strikes and it's a good thing

Hard to believe that the Luke Forward campaign is three years in the past. The marshaling of the community for an unprecedented level of support for a military facility on the outskirts of the nation's fifth largest city was truly remarkable. A partnership recognized by the Air Force senior leadership as the "gold standard" of military/community relations.

On reflection, there are many to thank and I am sure I would miss someone if I tried to name individuals, so let me just say that each and every city staff, from across the Valley of the Sun, along with business leaders and major land owners, and especially the Fighter Country Partnership staff rose to the challenge to ensure the continued long-term mission sustainability of Luke AFB. The mantra "Don't confuse us with Valparaiso and Eglin AFB" echoed throughout the halls of the Pentagon during the numerous trips to speak directly with senior leadership.

The result of all that hard work was two records of decision (ROD) placing 144 F-35 aircraft at Luke AFB while keeping 26 F-16s from the two foreign military sales squadrons, Taiwan and Singapore.

Today at Luke, we have received the first 29 of those 144 F-35s, and many more continue to arrive monthly. We are well on our way ... and even the possibility to grow further.

You will recall the consternation about noise and the impact that would have on the community. I am confident that if you're reading this newspaper, you will agree that the noise is nowhere near what those in opposition claimed and tried to warn the community of.

As I explained at the time and now have the luxury of looking back and saying "I told you so," the noise impact of the new fighters is not appreciably different than what the West Valley has experienced for the past three decades. Everyone will admit, me included, that the sound of the new fighters is a deeper tone, but not necessarily in volume. Our noise complaints

have not increased above the average and are still somewhat associated with the time of season when we all open our windows and enjoy the outside patios in the stay-cation months of October-April.

Those of you may recall the ASU professor that Lana Mook, now Mayor Mook, had invited

to talk about noise levels, and that he specifically said he expected those that were bothered by F-16 noise will continue to be bothered by F-35 noise, but those who have grown accustomed to the jet noise and let it filter into "background noise" will do the same with the F-35 noise. I think most of you will agree this has turned out to be the case. Another case of "I told you so"....

Truly, the citizens of the West Valley should take pride in actively participating in a project, EIS (Environmental Impact Statement), which resulted in the continued operations of Luke AFB for decades to come. Not only is training the "World's Greatest F-16 and F-35 fighter pilots" a critical element of our nation's defense, it continues to be a \$2.17 billion annual economic impact to the state's economy.

However, as Col. Robin Rand, now general and Commander of Global Strike Command, once said when he was the Wing Commander at Luke ... "we collectively cannot, must not take our eye off the ball."

Vigilance is required, not so much from local developers, but from outof-state investors looking to buy land and develop it without understanding the compatibility issues between the community and the base. The real estate market has thankfully turned, but with it come new agents and investors looking to make a profit without knowledge of, or unfortunately, sometimes without care of the impact their project could have on the flight operations of Luke AFB.

My staff and I are fully engaged to continue to educate the community and prospective developers to the mission requirements of the base. We are blessed with each of the surrounding political subdivisions and their unwavering support of the mission.

On behalf of Brig. Gen. Scott Pleus and the 5,000 Airmen at Luke AFB, we thank you.





Of course, it would be impossible to make these programs and events happen if it weren't for our generous sponsors, grants, and gracious community partners. With that, I'd like



Benevilla honors vets, celebrates 70th anniversary of end of WW II


Benevilla, the West Valley's premier human services nonprofit, celebrated the 70th anniversary of the end of World War II in August.

Fairchild on a refueling mission; site visits to other bases; receiving my call sign "Eagle" during a trip to Nellis AFB, Las Vegas; receiving an F-16 orientation flight; serving food at base holiday functions; soliciting prizes for the Fighter Country Blue Blazer golf tournament fund-raiser; participating in the Fiesta Bowl Parade walking with the inflatable U.S. Flag; observing the "Haboob Havoc" (bombing competition on the Barry M. "dining in." A "dining in" is a formal (black tie) military ceremony for members of a unit which includes dinner, drinking and other events to foster camaraderie and esprit de corps. Prior to this particular "dining in" event, the Command Chief provided me a retired military fatigue uniform.

I asked, "But what about the formal black tie?"

He told me, "this dining in wasn't that type of dining in."

Upon arriving at the hangar where the dining in was taking place, I was asked to assist in checking in the attending Airmen and guests. Much to my surprise, they all checked in wearing military gear that bore resemblance to Halloween or the American Epic movie "Animal House" starring John Belushi. These guests came armed to the hangar with water cannons, water pistols, water balloons and other 5- to 14-year-old age range toys of fun to accommodate water weaponry. Walt Disney inspires 62nd Fighter Squadron

Everyone had a role to play during World War II, at home and abroad. For Sgt. Seymour Pine, it was serving in the 62nd Fighter Squadron, assigned to the 56th Fighter Group at Luke Air Force Base as a Stars and Stripes reporter.

He performed many functions as a reporter, to tell the Army Air Corps story. His main job was to interview P-47 pilots within the squadron. He served in England at the Royal Air Force Station Martlesham Heath during World War II reporting the war efforts.

While stationed at Luke, Pine had the unique privilege of accepting the 62nd Fighter Squadron emblem of a boxing bulldog from the artist who drew it--Walt Disney.

"Going through my father's things, I found what I thought were the original photos of Walt Disney presenting my dad with the squadron emblem," said Richard Pine, Sgt. Pine's son who resides in Georgia. "Disney designed it and presented it to my father. Knowing my father was involved in this moment in history and meeting Disney is just amazing. To know my father accomplished the things he did in England and in the states makes me very proud to be his son."

After the bombing at Pearl Harbor Dec. 7, 1941, fears and rumors spread that California would become another target. According to the Walt Disney Family Museum, Disney's studio manager called him that night to tell him that the Army would be moving in on us." The next day, after war was declared, Disney's studio lot was turned into a military installation to protect a Lockheed aircraft plant that was nearby.

Disney productions had to drop all future projects and begin work on military training films commissioned by the military. Disney's traditional cast

of characters, including Donald Duck, Goofy, and the Seven Dwarfs were featured in many of the shorts used to educate, inform, and incite the public about the war.

Disney himself took on a personal project for the war effort, which was creating unique insignia to not only bring humor to units, but to help boost morale at home and overseas. More and more of Disney's art was used as decals on tanks, trucks, bombs, planes and many different types of military transport and equipment.

Disney created an insignia design unit within Disney Productions Studios. Working with Hank Porter, Roy Williams, Bill Justice, Van Kaufman, Ed Parks, and George Goepper, Disney created more than 1,200 insignia throughout World War II. A valuable war effort by Disney and Disney Studios, he created them free of charge.

Disney himself served during World War I in France through the American Red Cross as an am-

bulance driver and understood the need to have something close to remind the men of home.


Disney once said "The insignia meant a lot to the men who were fighting. I had to do it. I owed it to them."

The 62nd emblem was completed in April 1943, while the squadron was fighting the Axis Powers in Europe. Disney personally delivered it, with Pine

accepting it on behalf of the squadron. The boxing bulldog is still used as the squadron's emblem and inspires the pilots of today, just as it did 74 years ago.

"It is a privilege to serve in a fighter squadron whose legendary past includes 12 aces, 357 kills, and a patch that was designed by Walt Disney," said Capt Joseph Stenger, 62nd FS A flight commander. "The pictures we have of the original 'Spike Aces' and squadron patch are a salient reminder we're serving in an organization that was taking the fight to the enemy long before we were born, and will continue to do so long after we're gone. Those P-47 pilots set the bar very high and it's our job to uphold the standard they set and ensure the pilots we train will do so as well."



Dalton recovers his confidence during day as a Marine

This was the day Dalton had waited for – and now fear and doubt hovered over him. He wasn't feeling his best because of his ongoing struggle with leukemia. Why today, of all days? What if he wasn't up to what awaited him during his wish to be a Marine?

Somehow, though, every concern started to fade when Dalton pulled on his combat utility uniform at Marine Corps Base Camp Pendleton. It was the first step of a Make-A-Wish experience that had extra meaning because of his uncle and grandfather who served in the military.


"I've wanted to be a Marine ever since my uncle got out of the Marine Corps," Dalton said. "I don't know what it is; I just love the Marine Corps."

Staff Sgt. Keith C. Becker, chief instructor trainer, Weapons and Field Training Battalion, Edson Range, took charge of Dalton's training. Becker started Dalton with martial arts training. From there, he moved to the obstacle course, which his Marine hosts call the O Course.

And that's where Becker truly saw the change that he made in Dalton's life. He saw a boy begin the day struggling with fatigue... but as Dalton faced the O Course, he witnessed his metamorphosis into a determined survivor. Every obstacle was a metaphor for Dalton facing leukemia. He overcame everything the O Course put in front of him, even those that he couldn't conquer on the first try. He just went back and tried again until he triumphed.

"He is what the Marine Corps needs," Becker said. "He has the heart and the drive that I think every Marine should have."

The rest of the day was a bit more relaxed, with tours of the Indoor Simulated Marksmanship Trainer and the Assault Amphibious School. Dalton received a coveted green shooting jacket embroidered with his name, a jacket which normally only the marksmanship instructors are allowed to wear.

Dalton was in for an extra surprise: The Marines took him aboard an Amphibious Assault Vehicle for a ride – he was in for a wild time as the driver maneuvered the vehicle over all the types of obstacles it's built to handle.

"Riding in the AAV was the thing I liked most about today," Dalton said. "I didn't know what to expect coming here today, but I had a lot of fun."

Every Marine who met Dalton was part of an event that helped shape his life. The confidence he rediscovered on the O Course and the time each Marine made for him could be just what he needs to put leukemia in his past. Today, he is in remission – and thinking often about his day as a Marine.



Teaching children how to manage money






