

## **Blood donors save heroes** like Officer Rob Sitek

People's lives can change in a split second, and those who work in public safety professions face that reality every day. Blood donors are heroes to people like Phoenix Police Officer Rob Sitek, who required 148 lifesaving blood transfusions, when he was shot in the line of duty and lost the equivalent of all the blood in his body five times.

**Officer Sitek is thankful** for the talented surgeons and blood donors who saved his life.

"I applaud people who give blood regularly," he said, "because their donations were available to my doctors when I was severely injured and needed it most."

United Blood Services is Arizona's largest nonprofit community blood provider, serving more than 60 hospitals across the state. Nearly 500 blood donors are needed every day to meet the transfusion needs of patients in those hospitals. In Arizona, United Blood Services has also been

established as one of the approximately half-dozen national hubs to supplement military blood supplies in the event of an emergency.



## Governor signs HB 2324 as a boost to Arizona military families

A bill to allow spouses of active duty military personnel stationed in Arizona to qualify for Arizona resident hunting and fishing licenses has been signed into law. Gov. Doug Ducey signed House Bill 2324: G&F; military spouses; resident licenses, sponsored by Rep. Frank Pratt (LD-8, Casa Grande).

The Arizona Game and Fish Commission voted unanimously at its January 2016 meeting to support this expression of gratitude for the families whose service and sacrifice protect our liberties. Under current law, an active duty member of the armed forces of the United States stationed in Arizona either permanently or temporarily may purchase a resident license permitting the taking of wildlife. HB2324 now extends that privilege to their spouses as well. "In partnership with Rep. Pratt, the Arizona Game and Fish Department and Commission are proud to honor our active duty military and their spouses. We thank them, and all our veterans, for their sacrifice and service to this country." said Commission Chairman Kurt Davis.

A valid license is required for taking wildlife, including fish, in Arizona. A resident of Arizona can

enjoy the benefits of a combination hunting and fishing license, valid for 365 days from the date of purchase, for only \$57.

An Arizona resident is a person who is domiciled (claims the state of Arizona as their permanent home and principal residence) in this state for six months immediately preceding the date of application for a license, permit, tag, or stamp and does not claim residency for any purpose in another state or jurisdiction.

Through the years, the department has consistently implemented programs that provide hunting tags and opportunities for veterans, wounded warriors, and military personnel to hunt on military installations throughout Arizona.

The department also has partnered with non-profit organizations serving veterans so that unused hunting permits or tags may be donated to veterans with service-connected disabilities.

#### Walmart hires more than 3,400 veterans in Arizona

Walmart announced last month it has hired 130,828 veterans nationwide since announcing its Veterans Welcome Home Commitment in May 2013, including more than 3,400 in the State of Arizona, which represents a 39-percent increase in veteran hires in the state since last year alone. Of those 130,828 veteran hires, 15,176 have been promoted to jobs with higher pay and greater responsibility.

"Now that our economy is growing again, I have three words for Arizona employers: Hire a veteran," said Arizona Gov. Doug Ducey. "Our men and women in uniform have proven their leadership, resilience and adaptability again and again. Simply put, they make great employees. That's why I commend Walmart for making a difference in the lives of these individuals by pledging to hire at least 250,000 honorably discharged veterans by the end of 2020."

Master Sgt. Troy Clanagan retired from the U.S. Air Force in 2012, following a 20-year career. He's now putting the same leadership qualities he displayed with our nation's military to work in his role as an assistant store manager for Walmart in Phoenix.

"Coming from a military background, I'm accustomed to managing people and meeting deadlines. That experience has translated well to this fast-paced retail environment," Clanagan said. On Memorial Day 2013, Walmart introduced the Veterans Welcome Home Commitment, which guaranteed a job offer to any eligible, honorably discharged U.S. veteran who was within 12 months of active duty. The initial goal was to hire 100,000 veterans by the end of 2018.

In May 2015, Walmart announced the expansion of that original projection, with the goal of hiring 250,000 veterans by the end of 2020.

Walmart has also changed the eligibility from within 12 months of active duty, to any veteran who has been honorably discharged since the announcement of the commitment in May 2013.



## Air Force pilots, maintainers on F-35 pros and cons

As the Air Force races to declare its F-35 jets operational before the end of the year, observers are still warning about schedule delays, a faulty logistics system, and software glitches.

But at Edwards, the pilots, maintainers and technicians of the F-35 integrated test force say they are happy with the plane – in fact, in many ways the joint strike fighter is a huge improvement over legacy systems.

#### 'The Burger King jet'

Lt. Col. Raja Chari said the biggest difference between the F-35 and flying legacy platforms is that the pilot, freed from basic "stick and rudder" tasks by the JSF's automation, is able to focus on mission planning.

"Each plane is its own command and control platform," said Chari, who began his career flying F-15s and is now director of the F-35 ITF and commander of the 461st flight test squadron. "You don't have to do as much stick and rudder, just getting to and from, because there are so many automated modes to use on the F-35 ... (It) is almost as easy as breathing."

Maj. Raven LeClair, assistant director of operations for the 461st flight test squadron, told Defense News May 4 he likes the F-35's touch screen display, which each pilot can customize to his or her liking.

The "glass," as pilots call it, looks like two iPads sitting next to each other. Pilots can divide the screens any way they want to easily see different systems, Chari said.

Pilots can easily change the display anytime just by scrolling through these "portals," using the "handson throttle and stick," or HOTAS, he added.

"It's the Burger King jet," Chari said. "You can have it however you want, your way."

Combined with the Gen III helmet, the user-friendly display gives pilots a comprehensive picture of the entire battlefield, Chari

emphasized.

"In this plane, it's 360 degrees and a much larger range of stuff that you are looking at, so that you are not just thinking about what your particular jets doing, but now you are looking at other elements in a notional strike package," Chari said. "So whether that's looking at ground targets, or emitters, or air targets, you are building a much bigger picture than the traditional planes."

Pilots are also happy with the jet's high angle of attack, or AOA, capability, as well as its ability to perform high alpha maneuvers, Chari said. As airmen gain more experience flying the JSF, they are learning some "tricks of the trade" for handling a close-in fight, he added. He declined to be more specific, because the information is classified.

Chari is looking forward to the integration of the AIM 9X missile, which will come as part of the final 3F software package. The combination of the F-35 airframe, the AIM 9X and the Gen III helmet is "a dogfighting gamechanger," he said.

#### Maintainers weigh in on ALIS

Officials say ongoing challenges with the F-35's

Autonomic Logistics Information System, or ALIS, is the single biggest obstacle to declaring the Air Force jets operational on time. An internal diagnostic system that tracks each part of each plane worldwide, ALIS has been the subject of frequent criticism over the years, including the recent claim that if a single server goes dark, it could cripple the entire F-35 fleet.

But maintainers at Edwards AFB say that claim is ludicrous. Even if the power goes out, the team can still use ALIS, said RJ Vernon, supervisor for AF-3. All of the jet's information is stored in a device called a portable maintenance aid, or PMA, which the team can load to the main ALIS data base once the power comes back on.

"We've had that happen multiple times, and we can still use ALIS," Vernon told *Defense News*.

If the power is out for long enough, the team may have to track maintenance and manage daily operations manually, as legacy systems do. But the chances of that happening are very slim, he added.

For day-to-day operations, the airmen and Lockheed Martin contractors here generally agree ALIS has made their lives easier.

"It tells you everything you need to know instantly," Vernon said. "ALIS reduces our troubleshooting drastically, it makes my job very easy."

AF-3 crew chief Staff Sgt. Cody Patters, who previously worked on A-10s and F-16s, agreed, saying the F-35 is significantly easier to take care of than legacy systems. The only

## Air Force vocalist and pilot reunited

Master Sgt. Anne Baker, soprano vocalist with the U.S. Air Force Singing Sergeants, sang the national anthem for her birth son's pilot graduation May 20 at Luke Air Force Base.

1st Lt. John Lorbiecki was adopted shortly after birth by John and Patti Lorbiecki of Hubertus, Wis. In 2007, at the age of 21, he initiated an internet-based adoption search in hopes of finding his birth mother.

"I always had a natural curiosity about my birth parents that anyone would have in the same situation," Lorbieki said. "Those questions typically evoke a wide variety of emotions. However, even before I met her, I still respected her for making the courageous decision to give someone like to parent a child the opportunity."

Three years later, Baker stumbled onto then Tech. Sgt. Lorbiecki's adoption page which contained his current contact information.

"There wasn't a day that went by that I didn't think about meeting him," she said. "Once I came across his page,

who desperately would I knew I needed to get permission from mom and dad before going any further. I gave them a call and they were so welcoming to the idea."

> Moments later, Baker was speaking to her birth son on the phone for the first time.

"Out of nowhere, I got a phone call from her," he said. "My parents' amazing support meant a lot to me. It was a surreal moment, especially because I didn't expect it."

As the two talked and compared life stories, they were surprised to find both chose to make a career in the Air Force. He began serving in the Wisconsin Air National Guard with the 115th Fighter Wing based at Truax Field in Madison, Wis. She began by serving as a vocalist in the U.S. Air Force Band of Mid-America at Scott Air Force Base in Belleville, Ill.

"The Air Force was something he always wanted to do," Baker said. "We were both wearing blue all these years and didn't know it. My father was an Air Force pilot in the 1950s, so John had it in his blood."

Lorbiecki and Baker met face to face in October 2010. They have stayed in close contact ever since.

"We met and it really was like we had known each other our whole lives," Baker said. "His whole family has been so welcoming."

When Baker received the phone call from the 310th Fighter Squadron, requesting her to sing the national anthem for this ceremony, she was thrilled.

"It's a special honor and privilege for me to be part of this ceremony at one of the most pivotal times in John's career, and also to have the

blessing from his family and his commander to participate," Baker said.


The moment also meant a lot to Lorbiecki.

"I was able to have my adoptive parents and my birth mother in the same room during the most important graduation ceremony of my life," he said. "Professionally, getting to this day was always my true goal. I look at it as a celebration of making it happen when others thought it was impossible. Friday night was a very simple event but it was significant for both of us."

Despite time, distance and different directions in life, both have ended up in a similar place. They are fulfilling their lifelong dreams in the Air Force, and they get to do it together.



"Making sure that each child gets a chance to develop to their full potential is crucial," Thompson said. "Parenting is not an automatic thing. Most parents only know what they read or from what they see others do, but really, they need to get expert advice if they are going to help their child be successful. The first years 0-5 are crucial in that development, and FTF is that organization that can help them in so many different ways."

She has invited FTF to train staff at the Readiness Center to make them aware that about 90 percent of a child's brain develops before age 5, so the job of helping them succeed starts on the day

they are born. Thompson also shares FTF resources and programs available to Arizona families. "If parents can utilize

those services, their child

Thompson, who works specifically with families with dependents or spouses with special needs. About half of the families she works with have children under age 6.

Thompson has shared information with families at three large family events. In addition, each month, a Bundles for Babies educational program is held for new and expecting parents at the Base. They receive a package of items for their baby, as well as helpful literature and resources.

FTF's parenting information is included in those resources.

"A lot of our parents are very young families, in their late teens and early 20s, and they are away from extended family, so there's really no one there to guide them," Marjorie said. "There's no one there to help them with that information about raising their first child; it's like they can get an extended family with FTF. They can learn a lot from the classes and other services."

"Combat stretching" is the nickname Brian Thomas uses for the style of yoga he teaches twice a week for the Arizona Air National Guard's 161st Air Refueling Wing at Sky Harbor.

Officially known as Baptiste Power Yoga, it is a practice that helps students develop the focus, training and insight needed to achieve consistent results in life. Physically as well as mentally challenging, it works well alongside the military's routine physical training.

"I was immediately hooked by the intense physical challenge," Thomas says, "along with so many other benefits, such as reducing stress."

Despite that, Thomas says, yoga carries a stigma that sometimes discourages people from giving it a try.

"Yoga is for everyone; everyone can do it," he says. "Sometimes I call it combat stretching just to get guys into my class and have them break down the bricks in the wall, really open themselves up and find themselves on the mat, have a good time and see the benefits of it."

It was at a 2013 workshop on teaching Baptiste-style practice that Thomas learned about Joined Forces Yoga, a 501(c) nonprofit organization that brings free yoga to U.S. military personnel wherever they are. The group provides a qualified instructor, yoga mats and additional equipment; all students need to do is show up and participate.





## 56th Medical Clinic undergoes renovations

The 56th Medical Group clinic is currently undergoing renovations to modify the building layout and reduce the energy footprint.

Construction on the 35-million-dollar project started early February and will be completed in November 2017.

"A lot of the old infrastructure, 'heating, ventilation, and air conditioning, plumbing and electrical are being upgraded," said Michael Perna, 56th Medical Group facility manager. The 100,000-square-foot renovation reconfigured and modernized many sections of the clinic and focused on improving the building layout and reducing patient stress.

New furnishings will be included in the waiting rooms, offices and exam rooms. The renovations also include new paint, carpet and flooring.

"The infrastructure changes not only help decrease energy cost, but also provide a comfortable work environment for our staff," Perna said. "This will provide an outstanding health care experience for our patients.

"Day-to-day operations during construction have been seamless to our patients. While the staff has noticed the bulk of the disruption, they have done a tremendous job maintaining a high standard of patient care."

The clinic serves more than 6,000 active duty personnel and 84,000 beneficiaries.

More than 500 staff members provide care and administrative support to more than 1,300 surgeries and 130,000 ambulatory visits every year.


