# 63rd AMU building best future airpower

Since the arrival of the first F-35A Lightning II to the 63rd Fighter Squadron at Luke Air Force Base earlier this year, maintainers, crew chiefs and other respective maintenance positions have been steadily working to continue developing Airmen toward building the future of airpower.

The 63rd Aircraft Maintenance Unit officially opened its doors Oct. 1 and has since led to the success of 162 sorties and 228.3 flying hours in support of

Luke's F-35 program.

"The 63rd AMU is contributing to the F-35 program by working out kinks with operations," said Capt. Cameron Taylor, 63rd AMU officer in charge. "We are getting the aircraft in the air to better the software and ready pilots for the impending arrival of more 3F aircraft."

tive maintenance positions have been steadily working to continue developing Airmen toward building the future of airpower.

The unit is the first Luke F-35 AMU to receive a 3F, or full-up, combat aircraft capable of pulling 9Gs in the air.

"Each unit has a significant job within the F-35 program to train pilots and maintainers," said Tech. Sgt. Derriel Morris, 63rd AMU noncommissioned officer in

charge of debrief. "The 63rd is unique because we are just getting started. Our sorties might be lower than other units right now, but we are going to keep ramping up to match, and, eventually, surpass them."

Currently, 146 personnel and seven aircraft are assigned to the 63rd, Taylor said. The AMU is scheduled to grow to approximately 200 personnel and 22 aircraft in the near future.

Through technological advances and continuous analysis, the F-35 program at the 63rd AMU and Luke, as a whole, continues to directly build the future of airpower from within the 56th Fighter Wing.



# From the Desk of Fighter Country Partnership: Helping a neighboring military base rewarding for all

Let me set the scene for you. A few months ago, we had a meeting in our office with the vice commander of the 56th Fighter Wing at Luke Air Force Base. He brought with him the commander of a large unit at Marine Corps Air Station (MCAS), Yuma.

We soon discovered that the Marine Corps Air Station, Yuma was interested in implementing an Honorary Commander Program and were interested in how Luke developed its Honorary Commander program over the years.

Luke AFB has a very strong Honorary Commander program which has flourished over the past decade, or so. In basic terms, an Honorary Commander program brings prominent civilians onto a military installation and associates them with a military commander. In most instances, an Honorary Commander is associated in like terms (as much as possible) to the military commander. So, a civilian police chief would be a good candidate for a security forces squadron.

That can't happen in every instance, of course, but every attempt is made to make it happen.

At Luke, during their two-year term, the Honorary Commander and military commander reciprocate their professional know-how in their fields of expertise. The program is only as successful as what each commander (Honorary and Military) puts into it. It is an opportunity for the civilian leader to understand the military culture and lifestyle, and vice versa. It

is also not uncommon for a real friendship to foster over the two years.

So, we discussed in-depth, with the Air Force Colonel and Marine Colonel, what a Military Support Organization like Fighter Country Partnership (FCP) can do to help facilitate this program.

Over the next several weeks, information was shared via email between FCP and MCAS Yuma leadership about how to implement an Honorary

Commander program for their installation.
Next, we visited the MCAS commander and the Marine Weapons
School commander.

From the outset, we were aware that the MCAS Honorary Commander program would not be identical to the Luke program. And it doesn't need to be. The Marines will create and implement their own program organically and it will build and flourish over the next several years. After leaving the meeting, we could feel the momentum starting to grow.

The City of Yuma is similar to Phoenix in the strong community support they provide to their prospective military installations. All of the meetings with the MCAS, Yuma leadership shared a common theme: the "want" and

desire to further build relationships with their community. But they were unsure about the mechanism to bring it to the forefront.

The same could be said for Yuma-50, the local Military Support Organization (MSO). Both organizations want to build on their existing relationships and FCP is excited to be a part of facilitating the growth of this program.

We headed back to Yuma weeks later to further our meetings with Yuma-50 and MCAS, Yuma. This visit was a little different. FCP brought a group known as the Blue Blazer Squadron (BBS). The BBS is a Luke AFB Honorary Commander alumni program. In order to become a Blue Blazer Squadron member you must have served

honorably during your tenure as an Honorary Commander at Luke AFB.

This visit, which doubled as a BBS offsite, was meant to highlight the potential for growth of an engaged Honorary Commander program. This was an opportunity for us to talk about Honorary Commander programs and for them to discuss Marine Corps culture.

The already demonstrated, "want" for an **Honorary Commander** program is there. So, now, we need to determine the "how" and "who." We discussed further categories of civilians that might be good fits with Marine Corps squadron commanders. The Blue Blazers all described their professions; from commercial real estate developers to architects, engineers, managers,





# 500th F-35 pilot takes to the sky

The U.S. Air Force trained and graduated the 500th F-35 Lightning II pilot across the joint and international enterprise Sept. 19 at Eglin Air Force Base, Fla.

Maj. Chris Campbell, 461st Flight Test Squadron director of operations, is an F-16 test pilot with more than 1,000 fighter hours and 245 combat hours. He began F-35 fighter pilot training at the 33rd Fighter Wing this summer and became the 500th pilot to graduate the program.

"As a test pilot, working on the F-35 is an opportunity for me to be a real force-multiplier," Campbell

said. "Flying the F-35 has been a long-term goal of mine. I am thrilled to be part of the program and I hope to make a positive impact."

While training as an F-35A student pilot at Eglin Air Force Base, Campbell completed approximately 200 hours of academics, 14 simulators, a high-speed taxi, and six flights in the aircraft before being deemed qualified.

The coursework takes full advantage of emerging technology by leveraging virtual reality training for pilots to compliment the military's most advanced weapon system.

"As we discover new ways to employ the F-35, based on its expanding capabilities, we have to adapt the way we train our pilots to ensure they meet the needs of our combat air forces," said Col. Paul D. Moga, 33rd Fighter Wing commander. "The world of fifthgen tactics is rapidly evolving. It is changing the way we think, train and execute as a joint and multinational force."

Since the first aircraft was delivered in 2011, the F-35 enterprise and integrated training program have delivered more than 200 additional jets, produced more than 4,500 maintainers, and flown more than 100,000 hours.

"The F-35 and the capabilities it brings to the joint fight are key to the Air Force's ability to dominate in any airspace," Moga

said. "The Airmen we train and graduate today are the finest in the world. Their skills, coupled with the survivability and lethality of this weapon system, will ensure continued air superiority for the U.S., our partners, and our allies for decades to come. Five hundred down, thousands to go."

"This milestone represents the epitome of a team effort: active duty, Guard, Reserve, civilian, contractor, Air Force and Navy personnel all coming together with a common purpose to accomplish a common mission train and graduate outstanding professionals for the combat air forces."

Campbell plans to use his ex-

perience as a legacy test pilot to help improve the fifth-generation fighter through developmental testing on the aircraft.

"The F-35 will be the backbone of the Department of Defense's tactical fighter fleet," Campbell added. "Making the product better in the developmental test phase will have a huge positive impact on the Combat Air Force in the future."

Eglin AFB is one of two bases in Air Education and Training Command responsible for the F-35 training mission. Together, Eglin AFB and Luke AFB, Arizona, enable AETC to provide F-35 flying and maintenance training that are critical to the joint fight.

etc. This was done to capture a pool of professions from which to seek good Honorary Commanders.

As we learned over our many visits, the Marine Corps is organized differently than the Air Force. I think it's fair to say there are many differences between the Air Force and Marine Corps.

During our four days in Yuma, the

Marines gave us a real look into their culture. They brought us out onto the flight line to look at several Marine Corps helicopters. This alone was cool.

But the truly awesome part was talking with the young Marines who were at MCAS, Yuma to attend the Weapons Instructors Course. There were Marines from Japan, and other overseas locations, as well as other Marine installations across the U.S. It's always gratifying and heartwarming to talk with young service members about why they joined.

We were given a tour of the Marine Corps "Weapons School" and educated on how Marines come to Yuma from all over the world to become weapons instructors and trainers for the entire fleet. FCP and the BBS are so thankful to the Marines and Yuma for allowing us to participate in this unique experience.

It was an incredible opportunity to stand shoulder to shoulder with Marines from all over the world. It is an equally incredible opportunity to help form the new MCAS, Yuma Honorary Commander program. Although the Air Force and Marine Corps cultures differ, there are many similarities. The same can be said for community support.

Phoenix is not Yuma and Yuma is not Phoenix, but their support and level of pride for their military personnel is equal. The Honorary Commander program that MCAS, Yuma builds will be different than Luke AFB's, but the end goal is the same...to build and foster a positive relationship between the military and civilian community.

# Airmen pay tribute to fallen with Trojan workout

Thunderbolts gathered Nov. 27 at the base of the Troy Gilbert Memorial Bridge to perform an intense workout to commemorate the life of a fallen hero, Maj. Troy Gilbert.

Before the 30 twoman teams started, Brig. Gen. Brook Leonard, 56th Fighter Wing commander, expressed a few words to Gilbert's family, friends and the participating Thunderbolts.

"At the apex of the Troy Gilbert Memorial Bridge is a plaque that outlines the service and sacrifice he gave for our country," Leonard said. "We use this bridge daily, and I never want crossing it to be routine. As we go through the workout, you'll notice the 34 repetitions were in honor of the age he passed away, 56 repetitions were done because he deployed out of the 56th Fighter Wing, 20 burpees simulat-

ing the 20 mm rounds he fired at insurgents to keep the soldiers on the ground safe, and the five different stations placed throughout the bridge are in honor of the five children he loved so dearly and left behind."

After the opening ceremony, five teams lined up to begin one of six heats.

At station one, participants completed 34 calorie rows, and 34 sumo deadlift high-pulls with a 53-pound

kettlebell for males and a 35-pound kettlebell for females. After both partners completed both exercises, they took the kettlebells and ran to the second station at the apex of the bridge.

At station two, one partner completed 56 squats while holding a weight, while the other did 56 kettlebell swings.

After completing each exercise, teams carried a

weighted plate and kettlebell to station three on the other side of the bridge.

Exercises at station three were the same as station one, except each participant had to burn off 34 calories on an assault bike, before completing 34 sumo dead-lift high-pulls.

Next, male and female participants carried 45and 25-pound weights, respectively, to station four at the apex of the bridge,

where they completed the other half of station two.

After station four, teams ran with weights to station five on the other side of the bridge and finished out the course with 20 synchronized burpees.


After the workout, Airmen reflected on what they had accomplished.

"I thought the hero workout was fantastic and for a good cause," said Capt. Christian Gordon, 56th Fighter Wing, chief of military justice. "I thought it was challenging, but achievable, and the speeches in the beginning motivated you to get the workout done."

Participants' journey of sweat and tears came to a final conclusion, leaving the teams with a better understanding of Maj. Troy Gilbert's life and the



sacrifice he gave for his country.

"We lost Maj. Troy Gilbert in an airfight during Operation Iraqi Freedom," said Retired Chief Master Sgt. Scott Dearduff. Today, we remember Troy's sacrifice. I know that if he was here, and I know he is up there looking at us, he would feel honored."

While Thunderbolts are focused on training pilots and putting jets in the air on a daily basis, taking the time to remember a fallen Airmen is just one way we take care of our own.







"There is so much to learn from our veterans, and their selfless act of serving our country...lessons and experiences that can be passed on," said Staff





## O-Negative Luke AFB blood donors are special heroes to Arizona patients

As the temperatures cool down in our state, Arizona's population rises with the influx of winter visitors. Along with this growth comes a greater need for blood donors. The cold and flu season often further impacts the need for blood, when many regular donors can't give due to illness.

Having an ample supply of Type O blood is especially important this time of year, because it gives doctors transfusion options when shortages of other blood types arise.

O-Negative: 6 percent of the population has it; 100 percent of patients can receive it.

The universal donor, O-negative is the only blood that can be substituted for all other types. In emergency situations, when there is no time to determine a patient's blood type, doctors depend on Onegative blood to sustain life until the patient can be stabilized. Having plenty of O-negative available to hospitals is important

because doctors routinely rely on O-negative blood when premature babies and infants under six months old require lifesaving transfusions.

A typical 6-pound newborn has only about 8 ounces (one cup) of blood and extremely tiny veins, making it difficult to conduct blood tests. Furthermore, because of their immature immune systems, neonates often lack the necessary factors to easily determine blood type. O-negative is the only blood type these babies can safely receive.

"My son, Dean, was severely anemic when he was born and needed a blood transfusion right away," Twila said.

Dean was later diagnosed with a rare condition called Diamond Blackfan Anemia. His body did not produce enough red blood cells to carry oxygen throughout his body, so he relied on red blood cell transfusions to live normally.

"Dean is type O-negative, and we have waited several hours to get a transfusion that is a match for him," Twila explained, "It is humbling to realize that my son's life is dependent upon other people donating blood. Every blood donor is a true hero to Dean."

elementary school children," Marsh said. "Their outlook and thank you for what we do. It's really cute and great laughs sometimes. I put it (a card) in my pocket and get it out and read it again."

While many packing volunteers may look at what they're doing as just items in a box, Marsh said it was more personal.

"You're putting a piece of yourself," he said. "It really makes a lot of difference that you take the time during the holiday season. At the end of the day, you get one of these boxes, see it's from Peoria, Ariz., they're thinking about you and your family."

Christmas for the Troops is the major event for Peoria Sunset Lions Club, and club president Rachelle Barrett happily reported this year, \$8,500 was raised to help pay for postage. She congratulated City of Peoria employees Tricia Bowling and Kristy Baker for personally collecting \$302 among their co-workers.

"Community is what helps overseas and at home," Barrett said.

Councilmember Bill Patena acknowledged the volunteers, reminding









#### Park University earns Top Five Best Colleges ranking

Military Times surveys colleges and universities annually to meticulously document the array of services, special rules, accommodations and financial incentives offered to students with military ties, as well as describe the aspects of veteran culture on campus.

In addition, the publication factors in data from the U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs and U.S. Department of Defense, and from U.S. Department of Education sources: the Integrated Postsecondary Edu-



cation Data System, College Scorecard and Cohort Default Rate Database.






